Read our article about the filename for PHP initialization files and determine what this filename is for your hosting account. For example, if you have Windows Hosting with Plesk, this filename is .user.ini. Look for that filename in the root directory of your account. That's the file you need to edit in the next step. If you can't find that file in the root directory, use a text editor to create the file and then save it in the root directory. Be sure you name the file as specified in our article. Edit the file Example:

```
memory_limit = 128M
max_input_vars = 2000
upload_max_filesize = 64M
post_max_size = 64M
max_execution_time = 120
```

Note: For specific info on these PHP settings, see <u>the PHP documentation for core php.ini directives</u>. Take the necessary steps for the changes to take effect. Use a phpinfo file to confirm the changes are complete.
