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Follow these steps to fix plugin errors in WordPress. Prepare your WordPress site for the troubleshooting: You should always make a backup of your site before performing any troubleshooting. Disable all WordPress plugins; especially any caching plugins. Disable WP_CACHE if your site uses it. Understanding a WordPress related PHP error If your previous troubleshooting revealed a PHP error, use the following table to help understand the error.

Error Type	Definition and Next Steps
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E_ERROR	This is a fatal error that causes script termination. These are typically caused by calling a non-existing object like a class or function. This can often occur with version incompatibility. You should update your WordPress version, themes, and plugins.
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Update your WordPress components

When your WordPress version, themes, or plugins update, it can cause conflicts with the others. Updating all of your WordPress components can bring your site back to normal.
