

Change the domain name (common name) on my SSL certificate

You can change your SSL certificate's common name, which is the primary domain name that the certificate secures and encrypts. How you change your common name depends on where your certificate is currently hosted: Go to your [Heart Internet account](#). Select **SSL Certificates**, and next to the SSL certificate you want to change, select **Manage**. Select **Change the site that your certificate protects**. Select one of the following based on where your website is hosted:

2. Select **Add Change**.
3. If you provided a Certificate Signing Request (CSR) from your server when you got your original SSL certificate and you're moving to a new server, you'll need to add an additional change to [re-key the certificate](#) with a CSR from the new server. Select **Re-Key your certificate**, paste the new CSR, and select **Add Change**.
4. Select **Submit All Changes**.
