

What are the default privileges for MySQL databases?

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On all MySQL databases created on our servers, the current privileges are given as default: SELECT â€“ Selects data in tables or columns in the database INSERT â€“ Inserts data into tables or columns in the database UPDATE â€“ Updates the data in tables or columns in the database DELETE â€“ Deletes rows from tables in the database CREATE â€“ Creates new databases, tables, or columns DROP â€“ Removes existing databases, tables, and views INDEX â€“ Creates or removes indices of existing tables ALTER â€“ Allows you to alter tables in the database LOCK TABLES â€“ Allows you to lock tables within the database The following privileges can also be granted: CREATE TEMPORARY TABLES â€“ Creates temporary data tables in the database CREATE VIEW â€“ Creates new views of the data CREATE ROUTINE â€“ Creates stored routines in the database Please raise a Support Ticket with our Customer Services team to acquire these additional privileges.
