To upload your file to root: Log into your site through FTP or the File Manager Go to the directory that 'public_html' sits in Upload your files there To access your file: In any other file that needs to access that file, use the absolute server path: /home/sites/[DOMAIN]/[FILE] Where [DOMAIN] is your domain name (such as your-domain.co and [FILE] is the file name and extension (such as database.txt). Create a Password-Protected Directory Create a password-protected directory within your public_html folder. You can set up a password-directory folder in your eXtend Control Panel. To set up a password-protected directory: Log into your eXtend Control Panel Click 'Passwor Protection' under 'Web Tools' Enter in the directory you want to protect Enter in a username Enter in a password Clic 'Add Protection' The directory will now be protected

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
