

## Allow remote and unregistered domains in cPanel on my server

By default, cPanel blocks unregistered domains, or any domains that don't have DNS pointing to the cPanel server. You might need to use domains like these for testing or development work, so here's how to unblock those domains in cPanel for your Dedicated Server. Log in to your account. ([Need help logging in?](#)) Under **Manage Products** select **Manage Dedicated Servers**, select the Dedicated Server you wish to use, and select **Manage**. Click **Launch WHM**. In the WHM main page, select **Server Configuration** > **Tweak Settings**. Select the **Domains** tab. If the domain you want to use is live but not on your server, next to **Allow Remote Domains** select **On**.

Or, if the domain you want to use isn't registered (also called a "fake domain"), next to **Allow unregistered domains** select **On**.

At the bottom of the **Tweak Settings** page, click **Save**. Now you're ready to create your unregistered or remote domains in cPanel.
